Subject: Call for Nominations: Distinguished and University Professors

I request your nominations for the two titles, Distinguished Professor and University Professor, which we reserve for the small number of USC faculty who have brought special renown to the University through the excellence of their academic accomplishments.

1. Your nomination should be made by confidential memo sent to the dean of your school by September 18, 2009. In your memo, summarize the reasons the nominee merits the recognition.

- Particularly mention objective evidence of national and international stature, such as major prizes or medals or membership in the National Academies.
- For University Professor nominations, explain how the individual makes a significant interdisciplinary contribution. Note if he or she holds a joint appointment.
- Briefly summarize the nominee's special contribution as a University citizen. All nominees should have at least five years of full-time service at USC.

2. If the information is available without contacting the nominee, enclose the individual's CV including publications, honors, and grants.

3. The dean will forward all nominations to Vice Provost Martin Levine by October 2, 2009 with a memo containing the dean's recommendations and rank ordering.

4. A committee of current Distinguished and University Professors will then give its recommendations, and President Sample will make the final selection.

To avoid potential embarrassment, please do not inform the nominee, and please do not inform other colleagues. It may well happen that a nomination is deferred rather than approved. Appointments will not necessarily be made every year.

Distinguished and University Professorships are of equal rank and dignity, but they have different criteria. Promotion to the rank of Distinguished Professor marks outstanding contributions that have been primarily in a single discipline. In the words of the Faculty Handbook, it is “awarded on a very selective basis to those few professors in the University who have brought special renown to the University through their accomplishments.” The title of University Professor is awarded to those professors who have made significant contributions to several disciplines and so have personified the strategic initiative for interdisciplinary scholarship and teaching. As the Handbook explains, it is “awarded to a small number of professors who, because of their multi-disciplinary interests and significant accomplishments in several disciplines, qualify for an appointment that transcends any single field of study. Generally, a faculty member accorded this title also has a tenured faculty appointment in a specific academic unit.”

Our standards for selection are very high, and emphasize objective evidence of outstanding national and international stature. In the sciences, for example, we have far fewer Distinguished and University Professors than we have members of the National Academy. In making nominations, please do not overlook candidates who are women or members of under-represented minority groups.
