This year's Teaching with Technology grants will focus on advancing the university's emergency preparedness efforts. The 2010 program offers grants of up to \$10,000 for the development of one- to three- week student assignments that are accessible online through the Blackboard system.

This program supports USC's efforts to maintain classes in an emergency as described in the Provost's memo sent to the faculty on September 1, 2009.
