


The Higher Education Opportunity Act (PL110-315), approved in 2008, requires institutions to provide textbook information at the time a student registers for a course. Bookstores have to collect required textbook information in time for it to be included in the Schedule of Classes.

Course textbook information has now been added to the Schedule of Classes, www.usc.edu/soc/ . If textbook information has been provided to the USC Bookstore, an icon (a stack of books) will appear under the Info heading. When the book icon is clicked, the Book List will appear in a pop-up window. An example is shown below.

The goal is to provide the textbooks for courses when the Schedule of Classes is released for each term. Students will then be able to view the textbooks for a course when they register. In order to comply with the requirements, faculty will need to submit textbook requests on a revised schedule. The Bookstore will soon send out copies of the prior year's Faculty Textbook Requests to department coordinators and these are then forwarded to faculty for review. The due date for Faculty Textbook Requests for spring 2010 courses is September 21st. Please encourage faculty to submit their textbook requests by the due date.
