2010 Summer Federal Work-Study Program

The Summer Federal Work-Study program allows continuing students to work during the summer from May 13, 2010 to August 21, 2010 using work-study funds. The award amount for Summer 2010 will be approximately \$3,000.

To be considered for the program, student must fulfill the following requirements:

1. Have submitted the following 2010–2011 application forms by March 2, 2010:
 - Undergraduates and Graduates: Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Undergraduates only: CSS PROFILE® Application.
2. Demonstrate financial need for both the 2009–2010 and 2010–2011 academic years. Priority is given to high-need students.
3. Meet all general eligibility requirements for financial aid, including Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements
4. Submit a 2010 Summer Federal Work-Study Application, **completed by both the employer and the student**, to the Financial Aid Office in the lobby of John Hubbard Hall (JHH) by 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, March 31, 2010. No late applications will be accepted.
5. Be a continuing USC student and intend to register at least half-time at USC for the fall 2010 term. Students are not required to enroll during the summer.

Due to limited funding, we will not be able to accept appeals or late applications. Please turn in your application by the deadline of March 31, 2010.
