Note: If you do not have the above documentation because you recently were naturalized, or you became a U.S. citizen as a minor, and you have not yet received a Certificate of Naturalization or U.S. Passport, submit an explanation. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> U.S. Permanent Resident | Permanent Resident Card (I-551); or Resident Alien Card (Form I-551); or Departure Record (Form I-94A) or Arrival Departure Record (Form I-94) with the endorsement: "Processed for I-551", "Temporary I-551" or "Processed for I-551." Temporary Evidence of Lawful Admission for Permanent Residence"; or Visa in an unexpired foreign passport with a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) inspector admission stamp and the statement "UPON ENDORSEMENT SERVES AS TEMPORARY I-551 EVIDENCING PERMANENT RESIDENCE FOR 1 YEAR"; or U.S. Travel Document (form I-327) with stamp "Permit to Reenter". |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Refugee | Departure Record (Form I-94A) or Arrival Departure Record (Form I-94) with stamp showing admission as refugee under Section 207 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA) or "209a pending. Employment Authorized"; or U.S. Travel Document (Form I-571) with stamp "Permit to Reenter." |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Person granted asylum | Departure Record (Form I-94A) or Arrival Departure Record (Form I-94) with stamp showing admission as asylee under Section 208 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA) or "209b pending. Employment Authorized"; or U.S. Travel Document (Form I-571) with stamp "Permit to Reenter." |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Person paroled into the U.S for at least one year | Departure Record (Form I-94A) or Arrival Departure Record (Form I-94) with an unexpired stamp indicating "Alien paroled into the U.S. pursuant to Section 212(d)(5) ..." or an unexpired stamp indicating that you have been paroled into the U.S. for at least one year. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Victim of Human Trafficking or Spouse, Child or Parent of Victim | Victim must submit certification or eligibility letter from the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Spouse, child or parent of victim must submit a copy of the victim's certification letter and a copy of their T-visa. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Battered immigrants-qualified aliens | I-797 form or a court order from an immigration judge confirming your status. |
