Test Score Guidelines

SAT/ACT

USC requires either SAT or ACT (with the optional Writing test) scores from:

- All freshman applicants attending high school in the United States (recommended for students in Canada);
- Freshman applicants who attend overseas American or international schools following the U.S. educational system;
- All other freshman who wish to be considered for merit scholarships; and
- Transfer students who have accumulated fewer than 30 transferable semester units.

SAT Subject Tests

SAT Subject Tests are required of students who attend a high school that is not regionally accredited, including home-schooled students.

Three are required of such applicants, including one in mathematics.

AP exam results

Freshman applicants who have taken Advanced Placement (AP) examinations during their junior year are encouraged to provide those results with their admission application.

TOEFL results

USC requires that international freshman applicants whose native language is not English take either the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the SAT or ACT. Transfer applicants who have completed a course equivalent to USC's lower-division writing requirement (WRIT-130) are exempt from this requirement.

How to send your scores

You must have your test scores sent directly to USC by the agency administering the examination.

Applicants should take tests early, preferably in early fall. When requesting that your test results be sent to USC, use the following code numbers:

- **USC SAT: 4852**
- **USC ACT: 0470**
