**CROSS-TOWN RIVALRIES RENEWED WITH
USC AND UCLA MY TOWN NIGHTS AT DODGER STADIUM**

Fans encouraged to show school spirit at September 14 and September 20 games

LOS ANGELES – The Los Angeles Dodgers will continue to pay tribute to the USC/UCLA cross-town rivalry with a USC My Town night on September 14 vs. the Pirates and a UCLA My Town night on September 20 vs. the Giants at Dodger Stadium. Fans will have the opportunity to sit in a special My Town section, entitled Dodgertown, USC/UCLA and receive a free Dodgertown t-shirt, featuring team colors and the respective school's logo.

The September 14 game is also designated as USC Night with pre-game festivities including The Spirit of Troy USC Trojan Marching Band performing the national anthem and a ceremonial first pitch by band director Dr. Arthur Bartner, who is celebrating his 40th year in that position. The band will also perform God Bless America during the seventh-inning stretch.

The Dodgers celebrated UCLA Night on April 16 with Men's Basketball Coach Ben Howland throwing a ceremonial first pitch, ROTC color guard presenting the colors and performing the National Anthem, and a UCLA student singing God Bless America.

Fans sitting in the My Town section, which is located in the Lower Reserve section 56 and 60, will enjoy special entertainment, receive a free Dodgertown USC/UCLA-themed t-shirt, enjoy unlimited favorites including cheeseburgers, BBQ chicken, and watermelon, in addition to unlimited Dodger dogs, nachos, peanuts, popcorn, and soft drinks. Tickets start at \$35 for groups and \$45 for seats purchased in advance.
