

STUDENT WORKER (NON-WORK STUDY), SUPERVISOR

An undergraduate student worker enrolled at least half-time (6 units per fall and spring term) or a graduate student worker enrolled at least half-time (Masters candidate = 4 to 7 units and Doctoral candidate = 3 to 5 units) who provides leadership, guidance and direction to other students, student workers, volunteers and/or temporary workers and/or schedules, assigns and prioritizes workloads of other student workers, volunteers, or students. Graduate students enrolled in a class (e.g., dissertation class) designated as an exception by Academic Records Services does not have to meet the minimum unit requirement above to work. Undergraduate and graduate students not enrolled during the summer may work this period of time if their intent is to enroll in the Fall. A non-work study student worker is not limited in the number of hours worked.

COLLEGE WORK STUDY STUDENT WORKER, SUPERVISOR

A Federal Work-Study undergraduate student enrolled at least half-time (6 units per fall and spring term) or a Federal Work-Study graduate student enrolled at least half-time (Masters candidate = 4 to 7 units and Doctoral candidate = 3 to 5 units) who provides leadership, guidance and direction to other students, student workers, volunteers and/or temporary workers and/or schedules, assigns and prioritizes workloads of other student workers, volunteers, or students. Graduate students enrolled in a class (e.g., dissertation class) designated as an exception by Academic Records Services does not have to meet the above minimum unit requirement to work. Graduate students not enrolled during the summer may work this period of time if their intent is to enroll in the Fall. A Federal Work-Study student may work a maximum of 20 hours per week while school is in session and a maximum of 40 hours per week during vacations with their employer's permission. College work-study funds can not be used for overtime.
