



Financial Contributions for Use of the University Religious Center

Individuals and Organizations reserving a room in the University Religious Center for a meeting or social event are asked to consider a financial donation to the Ecumenical Mission.

How are these contributions used?

- to provide expendable kitchen supplies, i.e. dish soap, sponges, etc.,
- to repair and replace small furniture items damaged by heavy use,
- to supply “The Cheshire Cat”, student Coffee House, with free coffee for students on Friday nights,
- in URC outreach to the larger neighborhood, specifically with A Community Place and St. John’s Well Child Clinic.

Please note: Responses to your requests are made without reference to financial contributions.

Suggested donation: Recognized USC student groups are asked to make a donation only for large, special events. USC schools and departments are asked to make a donation of at least \$100.

How are they to be made? Donations should be in the form of cash or check, (we are not a university account so a requisition for a transfer of funds is not feasible).

If you are using rooms

For the United Ministry Lounge (103) the check should be made payable to United Ministry (federal I.D. 95-4744969)

For the Lutheran Lounge (202) the check should be made payable to Lutheran Campus Ministry (federal I.D. 95-2372395)

For the Episcopal Lounge (203) the check should be made payable to Canterbury USC (federal I.D. 95-4075792)

(Note: Denominational lounges are not available without permission of the Director of that ministry, and most lounges are heavily and regularly occupied.)
