You can build the capacity to create, lead, and enhance education for healthcare professionals worldwide. Our program builds on more than 40 years of successful faculty development at the University of Southern California, including masters-level training for health professions' faculty from around the world.

A Masters Program for Today's Challenges

Our goal is to cultivate leaders who will develop and advance educational programs for healthcare professions globally. Health professions education is continuously evolving, which requires leaders that are process experts with a broad repertoire of approaches that can be applied to varied content arenas and situations. The program addresses a challenge in health professions' education—the need for qualified educators who can model and lead change in their respective schools and programs. Graduates will be positioned to guide future generations of health professionals toward better meeting the health needs of our global society.

Who Should Apply?

Medical and health professions' faculty, prospective faculty or staff who are focused on education of health professionals at the undergraduate, graduate or continuing education levels should apply.

Program Objectives

Graduates will be able to demonstrate skills within academic medicine and health including:

- ◆ Developing, leading and evaluating programs
- ◆ Leading of self and others
- ◆ Designing curricula and assessing learners
- ◆ Addressing policy and accreditation issues and challenges
- ◆ Designing, implementing and studying innovations

Program Structure

The Master of Academic Medicine is offered through the Keck School of Medicine of the University of Southern California in collaboration with the Schools of Dentistry and Pharmacy. Our program employs a blended model, combining on-line coursework with on-campus face-to-face sessions, one week each March.

Most Coursework Completed from Your Own Computer

All you need is a personal computer with an internet connection. You will become part of a vigorous online community of learners growing together as leaders. The majority of sessions will be conducted using interactive computerized delivery methods. This model allows professionals to continue to work full-time throughout the program, while still being part of a cohort of educators from around the world.

Annual On-Campus Sessions Each March

All students will spend one week on campus in March of each year. Small group teaching sessions, led by faculty facilitators, will focus on community building and on development and evaluation of skills.

International Students

Special program arrangements can be made for international students in order to fulfill any individual national residency requirements. Please contact the Program Director, if you need such arrangements to be made.

Degree Requirements

A minimum of 32 units of graduate-level course work is required, 26 units of core coursework and 6 units of electives. A faculty advisor will help guide your decision about a program of study including selection of electives.

Tuition Cost

Tuition and fees will be at USC's prevailing graduate course rate.

Complete a Degree in 24 Months

The program can be completed in only six semesters, taking as few as two courses per semester.

Pre-Admission Process

All potential applicants should complete the pre-application information on the back of this brochure and fax it to (323) 442-2051 or email it nyquist@usc.edu.

Upon successful review of your pre-application information you will be notified. You will then apply through the University of Southern California's graduate application process as a candidate in the Master of Academic Medicine program.

Criteria for Admission

Applicants for admission to the Master of Academic Medicine program are generally expected to have an advanced degree in a health profession. Proof of graduation is required.

For applicants who do not have an advanced degree in a health profession, a bachelor's degree or its equivalent from an accredited institution is required. A grade point average of 3.0 (A = 4.0) is usually expected as well as satisfactory scores on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test.

Official transcripts and three letters of recommendation are required.
