ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. A citizen of the United States or a qualified foreign national.
2. A graduate from a school of medicine or osteopathic medicine in the U.S. or Canada, or a qualified foreign medical school.
3. Anticipate teaching in general pediatrics, general internal medicine, or family medicine upon completion of the fellowship.
