Each year there are approximately 750,000 stroke victims in the U.S., one every 45 seconds. Almost a quarter of these people die of their stroke. There have been tremendous advances in the care of these patients as their numbers grow. This course is designed to update physicians in the care of the acute stroke patient: ischemic or hemorrhagic, including arteriovenous malformations and aneurysms.

- ▶ recognize advances in radiographic imaging studies of stroke,
- ▶ understand the multidisciplinary approach to stroke,
- ▶ state new advances in stroke care and incorporate them into practice.
