COURSE DESCRIPTION

Max R. Gaspar, M.D. was an attending surgeon at the Los Angeles County+University of Southern California Medical Center for over fifty years, and served as Chief of Vascular Surgery at LAC+USC for twenty-five years. His teaching and scholarly accomplishments have had a lasting impact on vascular surgery in Southern California. This annual symposium, which honors Dr. Gaspar, addresses a specific topic of interest to surgeons, internists and family practitioners who care for the patient with vascular disease. Dr. Jonathan B. Towne, Professor of Surgery and Chief of Vascular Surgery at the Medical College of Wisconsin, will be the Gaspar Visiting Professor. Dr. Towne is an internationally known vascular surgeon who has had a

long-standing interest in lower extremity revascularization and is editor of the textbook *Complications in Vascular Surgery*. His symposium address is titled *Management of the Complicated Inguinal Wound*. In addition to Dr. Towne, a distinguished symposium faculty will discuss some of the most challenging problems in surgery. The Gaspar Lecture, to be delivered by Dr. Towne on October 1 on the Health Sciences Campus, is entitled *The Biology of the Autogenous Lower Extremity Bypass -- Long Term Results*. We look forward to seeing you at this year's symposium.
