PROGRAM INFORMATION

The *33rd Annual Diagnostic and Therapeutic Skills in Internal Medicine* course, the oldest and finest of its type, is designed to update general internists, internal medicine subspecialists, family medicine specialists, and other primary care health providers on current diagnostic and therapeutic skills. Focusing on the most common problems encountered in clinical practice, outstanding presenters who are expert leaders in their specialties will discuss timely issues in Cardiology, Endocrinology, Hematology, Hepatology, Infectious Diseases, Neurology, Otolaryngology, Psychiatry, Pulmonology, Rheumatology, Surgery, and Women's Health Issues.

This course includes five periods when three **simultaneous sessions** are offered, allowing participants to decide which session is of greatest interest. The smaller groups facilitate interaction between the presenter and participant colleagues. Two opportunities are offered for optional **roundtable discussions**. These sessions are limited to about ten people and have no agenda. Participants may discuss clinical experiences with a faculty expert and pose questions for discussion. **Seaside chats** are offered three afternoons, providing additional opportunities for participants to ask questions and discuss their experiences with a faculty expert.

At the end of the program, participants should be able to:

- ☼ use current concepts to diagnose and treat common problems in Cardiology, Endocrinology, Hematology, Hepatology, Infectious Diseases, Neurology, Otolaryngology, Psychiatry, Pulmonology, Rheumatology, Surgery, and Women's Health Issues;
- ☼ describe the appropriate clinical prevention of common medical problems;
- ☼ better manage their own problem patients as a result of intimate question-and-answer sessions with expert faculty.
