## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Vincent DeQuattro Symposium on Hypertension is designed as a practical update on the management of hypertension in the primary care setting for primary healthcare providers (internists, family physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and pharmacists) and is based on current research and clinical trials. This meeting will highlight the epidemics of metabolic syndrome and obesity, the importance of early recognition, and the role of hypertension control in the prevention of diabetes and cardiovascular disease. The program will also address the management of hypertension, resistant hypertension, and renovascular hypertension in select populations.

## OBJECTIVES

At the completion of the program, participants should be able to:

1. recognize the early signs of the metabolic syndrome and choose appropriate interventions,
2. discuss new technologies for the diagnosis of hypertension,
3. explain the importance of early diagnosis and treatment of hypertension in high-risk populations, emphasizing prevention of cardiovascular disease and diabetes,
4. make informed treatment decisions based on the latest data available.
